Kirtland Senior Center Monthly Newsletter





What an August! What a mess! Yes, I'm referring to the storm that brought many hundreds if not thousands of trees and limbs down all around the city. And as we all know, much of this crashing debris came down on power lines and interrupted electricity to residents and businesses throughout the city and Northeast Ohio. It was a storm for the ages all right!

As bad as things were, they could have been worse. And thanks to our Police, Fire, and Public Works Department, within six hours of the storm delivering its wallop, every roadway that wasn't affected by downed wires was cleared of any hazard. It was an incredible effort of cooperation and coordination by city staff that left their own powerless homes to make things as safe as possible for both the residents and the traveling public in Kirtland.

A special thanks to Fire Chief Hutton and Public Works Director Joe Fornaro for their dedication as they worked around the clock for many days to keep our residents safe. I'm not sure Joe was home for more than ten total hours over a six-day period. In fact, he even brought a generator from home to run one of our traffic lights!

Shifting gears away from the storm - in November, our voters will have an option to fund a long-term road funding solution. On the ballot, our residents will have an opportunity to allow City Council to adjust the income tax by one quarter of one percent to finance future road repairs. If voters choose to pass the Charter amendment, the additional income tax would cost a resident earning \$100,000 an additional \$250 per year. The new money raised would not affect retirement income for our seniors and will expire in twenty years. Additionally, the ballot language specifically states that funding can be used for road related projects only. In the coming weeks and months, I look forward to discussions with our residents as to the merits of the funding.

We're glad so many could hang in Geneva on the Lake for the day, and we're happy that the weather held off long enough to get in some putt putt. And for those who braved the uncertainty, we hope that you learned a ton from our tour of the Northeast Ohio Regional Sewer District tour. As a reminder, they host a Clean Water Fest every September that you won't want to miss! I go to this free event every year, and always leave with info, free stuff, and new friends. It is scheduled this year for Saturday, September 21 and I'd love to see you there. More info is available at https://cleanwaterfest.weebly.com.

Speaking of past trips and upcoming events, Ingenuity Fest will be held from September 27 - 29 in Cleveland. This Iconic Annual Festival of Art and Technology, Creativity and Innovation shows off the best of our City, and for those who went on the mystery trip, you know it will be topnotch!

I think this is one of the most important projects we have begun here in Kirtland, so I'm reprinting information from last month: At the end of last year, we were awarded grant funding through the state by way of the Commissioners Office for necessary programming. LAG stands for Life Adjustment Group, and is open to all Seniors. Dawn will facilitate two six-week sessions throughout the year for a small group of people who are interested in finding support, learning new coping skills, and journeying together through the tough times. As a society, we are quick to recognize grief in times of death and bereavement. Although this is accurate, we don't always acknowledge grief in times of adjustment. From receiving a hard diagnosis to struggling to maintain relationships with our grown children to the decrease of autonomy and independence as we age, all moments of significant change in our lives carry with them the possibility of grief, including the inevitable losses we face. Change is hard, and we are here to help you help each other. The first six-week session will kick off on September 16, and we invite you to sign up at the Front Office while spaces are available. In addition, we will also have monthly Open LAG Sessions. Each one will cover a different topic by inviting a speaker, coming together for an activity, sitting down for a meal, or welcoming conversation. These monthly gatherings will be advertised in advance, are free, and are open to everyone. Check out page 6 for this month's movie day! 
