RESOLUTION NUMBER 20-R-28

A RESOLUTION ACCEPTING THE BID OF ARMS TRUCKING COMPANY FOR ROAD MATERIALS, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the City of Kirtland must provide for the usual and daily operations of the Service Department in maintaining its streets and roads; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with its duty to maintain the streets and roads, the Service Department requires certain limestone materials to be delivered; and

WHEREAS, the City of Kirtland, in compliance with all bidding requirements as found in the Ohio Revised Code, solicited bids for the delivery of certain types of limestone; and

WHEREAS, the City of Kirtland unsealed and opened various bids relative to the delivery of road materials on May 6, 2020; and

WHEREAS, due to the current state of emergency in Ohio and the governor's current stay at home order stemming from the COVID-19 pandemic, the Kirtland Public Library and the Kirtland Community Center have both been closed to protect both the community and the staff from potential infection; and

WHEREAS, Kirtland Codified Ordinance 220.25 requires the posting of copies of enacted legislation for fifteen consecutive days in three places within the City, those being City Hall, the Kirtland Public Library, and the Kirtland Community Center; and

WHEREAS, Kirtland Codified Ordinance 220.25 grants City Council the authority to modify the posting requirement.

IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Kirtland, County of Lake and State of Ohio, that:

SECTION I: It is hereby determined that the bid of Arms Trucking Company, of East Claridon, Ohio for the delivered price of the following road materials is the lowest and best bid received after advertising in accordance with law.

500 tons, more or less, #10 limestone screenings, delivered price, \$19.75/ton;

500 tons, more or less #8 crushed limestone, delivered price, \$24.45/ton;

200 tons, more or less, #1/#2 limestone, delivered price, \$24.55/ton;

1500 tons, more or less, #57 crushed limestone, delivered price, \$24.35/ton;

1000 tons, more or less, #304 crushed limestone, delivered price, \$18.85/ton;

500 tons, more or less, #411 limestone, delivered price, \$20.25/ton.

SECTION II: The Mayor be and he is hereby authorized and directed to enter into a contract for the purchase of the above road materials, or so much thereof as may be needed, but not to exceed the appropriation from the street construction, maintenance and repair fund or road operating levy to pay the cost thereof.

SECTION III: The City Council, pursuant to its authority in Kirtland Codified Ordinance, Section 220.25 and due to the COVID-19 pandemic, hereby modifies the requirement to post this enacted legislation in three places and requires the following:

1. The Clerk of Council is hereby directed to post the enacted legislation in City Hall for fifteen (15) consecutive days after the effective date of this legislation; and
2. Due to the closures of the Kirtland Public Library and the Kirtland Community Center, the Clerk of Council is not required to post said enacted legislation in those locations; and
3. The Clerk of Council is hereby directed to post the enacted legislation on the City of Kirtland’s website for fifteen (15) consecutive days after the effective date of this legislation.

SECTION IV:

(a) It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this resolution were passed in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

(b) This resolution is declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety of the City, and for the further reason that it is necessary to provide for the usual and daily operations of the Service Department in maintaining the streets and roads of the City; wherefor, this resolution shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage by the affirmative vote of five (5) members of Council and approval by the Mayor, otherwise this resolution shall be in effect from and after its adoption at the earliest period allowed by law.
