CITY OF KIRTLAND

ORDINANCE NUMBER 22-0-17

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 254.29 OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF KIRTLAND REGARDING COMPENSATORY TIME, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 22-O-8 was passed on January 19, 2022, establishing Kirtland Code of Ordinance §254.29 relating to compensatory time; and

WHEREAS, the City of Kirtland desires to hire and retain the most qualified, best candidates available; and

WHEREAS, the City believes that compensatory time helps both the City and the individual employee and would like to extend this benefit to its hourly employees; and

WHEREAS, the City has determined that, due in part to busy seasons wherein employees can accrue significant hours of overtime to be converted into compensatory time, the accumulated hours of compensatory time should be increased from eighty to one hundred four hours.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Kirtland, County of Lake, State of Ohio, that:

SECTION I: Codified Ordinance Section 254.29, enacted by Ordinance No. 22-O-8, is hereby amended to read as follows:

§ 254.29 COMPENSATORY TIME

All full-time, hourly employees who are not subject to a collective bargaining agreement and have earned overtime shall have the option to take the time earned as paid overtime or as compensatory time. Compensatory time shall be credited at one and one-half (1 ½) hours for every one (1) hour of overtime worked. An employee shall not be permitted to accumulate more than one hundred four (104) hours of compensatory time. For purposes of compensatory time only, the fiscal year shall start on August 1 and shall end on July 31. At the end of the fiscal year, employees may cash in their compensatory time for payment at their current rate of pay. Employees may carry over to the next fiscal year a maximum of forty (40) hours.

SECTION II:

(a) It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.
