RESOLUTION NUMBER 22-R-69

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO ACCEPT A GRANT FROM THE STATE OF OHIO FROM THE SECOND ROUND OF THE OHIO FIRST RESPONDER RECRUITMENT, RETENTION, AND RESILIENCE PROGRAM, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the City has submitted an application to the State of Ohio's Emergency Management Agency for grant funding through the Ohio First Responder Recruitment, Retention, and Resilience Program which has been established through ARPA funding; and

WHEREAS, the State of Ohio has informed the City that its grant application has been approved, and grant funds in the amount of Five Hundred Eighty-Nine Thousand Sixty Dollars and Seventeen Cents (\$589,060.17) are available to the City to hire up to three full-time firefighter/paramedics; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to accept said grant and to commit the City to the hiring of said employees.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Kirtland, County of Lake and State of Ohio, that:

SECTION I: This Council hereby authorizes the Mayor or his designee to accept a grant from the State of Ohio's First Responder Recruitment, Retention, and Resilience Program for an amount up to Five Hundred Eighty-Nine Thousand Sixty Dollars and Seventeen Cents (\$589,060.17) to hire up to three full-time firefighter/paramedics for the City's Fire Department.

SECTION II: The Mayor or his designee is hereby authorized to execute all documents necessary to accept said grant, and all actions taken by the Mayor or his designee to accept said grant prior to the effective date of this Resolution are hereby ratified and approved.

SECTION III:

(a) It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal

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action were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.
