RESOLUTION NUMBER 22-R-77

A RESOLUTION ADOPTING THE UPDATED LAKE COUNTY HAZARD MITIGATION PLAN FOR THE CITY OF KIRTLAND, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, natural, technological, and human-caused hazards can affect the City of Kirtland; and

WHEREAS, significant structural, historical, and economic losses could result from an occurrence of a natural, technological, or human caused hazard events; and

WHEREAS, undertaking mitigation projects during pre-disaster periods could decrease the total losses Kirtland incurs as a result of said hazard occurrences.

AND WHEREAS, the Kirtland City Council has a strong interest in reducing losses from future hazard occurrences; and

WHEREAS, the hazard mitigation plan is a federal and state requirement to maintain eligibility for hazard mitigation funding, and, by that requirement, must be updated a minimum of every five years; and

WHEREAS, a cooperative, joint effort is a proven, efficient way to plan for and reduce hazard susceptibility in all government jurisdictions in Lake County, Ohio.

THEREFORE the Kirtland City Council has partnered with the county to update the existing *Lake County Hazard Mitigation Plan* in an effort to further identify, define, and characterize the hazards affecting the city as well as to continue identifying and prioritizing projects that could lessen hazard vulnerability.

NOW BE IT RESOLVED THAT by the Council of the City of Kirtland, County of Lake and State of Ohio, that:

- (b) This Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, safety and welfare of the City, and for the further reason that this plan must be adopted in order to ensure the safety and welfare of the City and to obtain potential FEMA funding if necessary; wherefore, this Resolution shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage by the affirmative vote of five members of Council and approval by the Mayor, otherwise this Resolution shall be in effect from and after its adoption at the earliest period allowed by law.
