## The CHAD Sticker Program *Courtesy of the Kirtland Kiwanis*

### What is a CHAD sticker?

CHAD stickers ensure rapid identification of a child in an emergency. The sticker contains a place to provide the names and phone numbers for a child's parents, physician, and other designated emergency contacts.

The sticker is not removable and resistant to smearing. The stickers should be placed in a standardized location for emergency personnel to easily access (i.e. under a car seat or inside of a bicycle helmet). The sticker should not be visible to someone casually passing by. Additional recommendations accompany each sticker.

### The History of CHAD

The CHAD identification program was developed as a result of a traffic accident involving a one year old child in Springfield, Illinois. Chad was in an accident that resulted in the death of his babysitter. Although injured, Chad survived the crash, but no one at the scene or hospital was able to identify him. Luckily an emergency room technician was a cousin of Chad's and able to contact the family.



## 2010 Census Data Released

2010 Census data is being released in phases. The Ohio Secretary of State has confirmed Kirtland's population, as of the 2010 Census, at 6,866.

Since the 2000 Census, Kirtland's population has grown by 196. Since the 1990 Census, Kirtland's population has increased by 14% (or 929 people).

The census is vital to our local community, as it affects long-term community planning, federal funding for local projects and determines how many seats each state will have in the U.S. House of Representatives as well as the redistricting of state legislatures, county and city councils, and voting districts. ## News from the Kirtland Fire Department

### Cardiac Monitors Added to Kirtland Ambulances



The Kirtland Fire Department has partnered with Lake Health to provide 12-lead cardiac monitor capabilities for each of our three ambulances.

The Lake Health Foundation recently purchased two LifePak 15 cardiac monitor/defibrillators for each of our front line ambulances. The specialized monitors are used to analyze and transmit 12-lead ECG's to our receiving hospitals.

During a myocardial infarction (MI) or heart attack, one of the coronary arteries becomes blocked. The patient may experience chest pain, shortness of breath, or sweating. Pain may also radiate to other parts of the body, such as the left arm, jaw, neck, etc.

The Kirtland paramedics are trained to recognize and treat an acute MI. The new cardiac monitors are a key tool in this early recognition. Once the 12-lead ECG is transmitted to the receiving hospital and an acute MI is diagnosed, the patient can then be transported directly to the Cardiac Catherization Lab. The Cardiologists can then use specialized interventions to open the blocked artery.


During an MI, every second is critical. In Lake County, success is tracked by "door to balloon" times. This includes the time from which firefighters leave the Fire Station to the time the patient is in the Cath Lab and the artery is re-opened. To date, there have been "door to balloon" times as short as 23 minutes in Lake County, greatly reducing cardiac muscle damage.

### Open Burning and Yard Debris

The City of Kirtland has adopted Ohio state law for open burns. An open burn is defined as the burning of any material where the smoke is emitted directly into the air without passing through a stack or chimney. Open burns are permitted in a few cases, such as cooking (campfires), bonfires, and for occupational needs, such as heating water, tar or for the warmth of workers. In these cases, Ohio law includes the following restrictions:

- The fire cannot be used for waste disposal, including yard waste.
- The size of the fire must be kept to the minimum necessary for the purpose.
- In no case can the fire be larger than five feet by five feet.
- Only dried firewood can be used. Trash, construction debris, or other waste is prohibited.
- The fire must be at least fifty feet from any structure.
- A water supply must be readily available.
- At least one adult must be present, and the fire cannot be left unattended.

Under Ohio law, yard and landscape waste cannot be disposed of by burning, but there are several other ways to dispose of debris.



Brush can be easily eliminated by chipping. The City of Kirtland offers such a service each spring. Alternately, you can rent a chipper or have a tree service handle the job. Sharing the job and costs with your neighbors is an excellent way to save money.

Leaf disposal is best handled by mulching with a lawn mower, as nutrients will be returned to the soil. If they are too thick, use a leaf blower or rake to spread them out after mulching. Leaves can also be raked into the woods or into a compost pile. The finished compost can be used on flower beds and vegetable gardens.

The great advantage to these methods of disposal is eliminating the potential for a major brush fire. A fast moving brush fire can destroy homes and property very quickly. These fires are extremely difficult to bring under control and can overwhelm even the best prepared fire department.


## Solicitor's Permit

All solicitors must register within the City of Kirtland. To obtain a solicitor's permit there is a \$150.00 applications fee, background check on all person(s) soliciting for a company, and approval from the Chief of Police.

Once an applicant meets all requirements, a permit will be issued by the Chief of Police. The registered solicitor will have a city issued permit indicating the person's name, photo, business they are soliciting for, city logo and the signature of the Chief of Police.

All solicitors are to have their permit visible at all times. Any unregistered solicitors may be cited for soliciting without a permit and could be fined up to \$500.00 or imprisoned not more than 30 days, or both.

Any resident of the city who wishes to exclude peddlers or solicitors from their premises may post a sign bearing the following notice: "Peddlers and Solicitors prohibited." Such placard shall be at least three and three-fourths inches long and three and three-fourths inches wide and the printing thereon shall not be smaller than 48 point type.



## Hunting Licenses

Deer hunting season is approaching quickly. The City of Kirtland allows archery hunting only. The archery season begins on September 24, 2011 and ends February 5, 2012. Hunting packets will be available September 6, 2011 from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., Monday through Friday.

To obtain a hunting license please follow the following procedure:

- Valid Ohio Deer Hunting license – must be shown at the time of registration
- Permission from the land owner to hunt on their property
- Property must be a minimum of 10 acres, no more than 3 parcels combined
- No hunting within 100 feet of lot line/residence/roadway/driveway
- Proficiency test – to be completed annually
- Identification with photo
- Deer kill must be viewed at the Kirtland Police Department within 24 hours
- First deer harvested must be an antlerless deer (as defined by the Ohio Department of Natural Resources, Division of Wildlife)
- Hunters must display issued placard in visible view on the vehicle dashboard while hunting

The City of Kirtland does not have a list of properties that are available to hunt on.



## Nuisance Animals

For removal of nuisance animals (i.e. raccoons, skunks, etc.), the Ohio Department of Natural Resources maintains a list of companies and individuals licensed to perform such removal. Please visit [www.kirtlandohio.com](http://www.kirtlandohio.com), and click on "Community Information" on the homepage and then select "Environmental/Animals" from the drop down menu for additional information and a list of removal specialists.

The Lake County General Health District will remove dead wildlife from private property, if the animal has been deceased for less than 48 hours. For removal or further guidance, please call 440-350-2543. On weekends you may leave a message with their answering service. There is no removal on weekends.

# CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS

## SR 306 Sewer Construction Completed

Under the direction of the Lake County Commissioners and Lake County Department of Utilities, construction of the SR 306 sewer project was completed earlier this summer.

All required pipe was installed along SR 306 and the Markell Road Pump Station was constructed. The Markell Station will service Kirtland's downtown area. The final testing for this station has been completed and accepted.

The Temple View Pump Station (a separate sewer project) was completed last fall. This station was constructed behind Kirtland City Hall and is tied into the new sewers on SR 306.


In 1990, the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency found bacteria in the East Branch of the Chagrin River and the Lake County Health Department traced it to the Temple View subdivision. More than half of the septic systems in this subdivision are failing. The new pump station will provide service for 52 homes. The City was awarded \$492,897 in federal stimulus (American Recovery and Reinvestment Act aka ARRA) money for the project via the Ohio EPA Water Pollution Control Loan Fund.

## Tibbetts Road

Work will be underway this August to improve drainage and resurface Tibbetts Road from Rt. 6 to the Chesterland border.


Tibbetts Road will remain open during construction; however, you may experience intermittent delays. Construction is expected to begin at the end of August and last a minimum of four to six weeks.

The Ohio Public Works Commission has awarded the City of Kirtland a grant of \$199,500. toward the cost of these improvements.



## Sperry Road at Rt. 6

Work was completed this summer to reprofile and resurface Rt. 6, west of Sperry Road. This work was done to improve visibility at this intersection.

## Mowing Maintenance

### Grass Clipping Tips for Residents

Mowing and maintaining lawns is an ongoing seasonal task. Grass clippings should not be blown into the street. These clippings flow into the stormwater system and into our streams and rivers. Grass clippings can clog storm drains and cause water to back up. Bacteria and insects may breed in this stagnant water and streets and yards may flood. Grass clippings that end up in our waterways contribute excess nutrients and pollutants to the water. These nutrients encourage algal growth, which can harm fish and other aquatic life.

Instead of bagging clippings, mulch the grass back into your yard as you mow or create a composting area in the yard. Mulching and making compost are simple tasks that are good for both landscaping and lawn. Good compost provides a ready supply of mulch and soil enhancers for planting flowers and vegetable gardens.

Grass clippings decompose quite rapidly and are high in nutrient value. They primarily contain nitrogen, potassium and phosphorus. If clippings are mulched back into the yard or used as compost, these nutrients are returned to the lawn. This is similar to giving the lawn small amounts of fertilizer continuously, which can save money in the long run by reducing the amount of commercial fertilizer needed to maintain healthy grass and landscaping.




